## What Is Holganix Made Of?

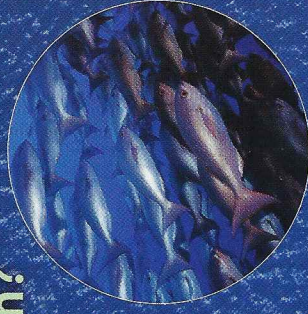

## Why Is Holganix Better For The Earth?

These areas, known as "dead zones", can now be found in the Delaware Bay, the Everglades, Chesapeake Bay, and the Great Lakes; as well as local bodies of water, with additional new zones forming every day.
